POLICY 31

PROCESSING SHED

Our Processing Shed is located on the Southeast corner of the council's property. This building was used to process animals that were injured or killed by vehicular traffic and were fit or partially fit for human consumption. The building is open to use by Council Members and their families and friends for a fee of \$25.00 per animal. Payment must be made prior to Processing Shed use. Council Members must be present at all times when family or friend are using the Processing Shed. The Processing Shed is to be used to field dress, skin and quarter the animal only. Cutting and wrapping must be done elsewhere. The Processing Shed is to be used on a first come first serve basis and you must sign in and pay before beginning use, at web site (to be developed if this policy is adopted).

All meat that is to be consumed must be removed immediately.

All portions of the carcass must be immediately removed from the premises and not placed in the dumpsters that are on site of the INWC. A fine of \$100 will be assess if any parts of the animal are left on site.

All water and hoses are to be drained. A fine of \$40 dollars will be assess if they are left undrained.

All walls, floor, countertops and Processing frame are to be washed clean (biodegradable soap) prior to leaving the site. A \$50 fine will be assess if area is seen or reported to have left in an uncleaned state.

The fines will be assessed to the Council Member.

Be courteous to the users that may be waiting to process their game.

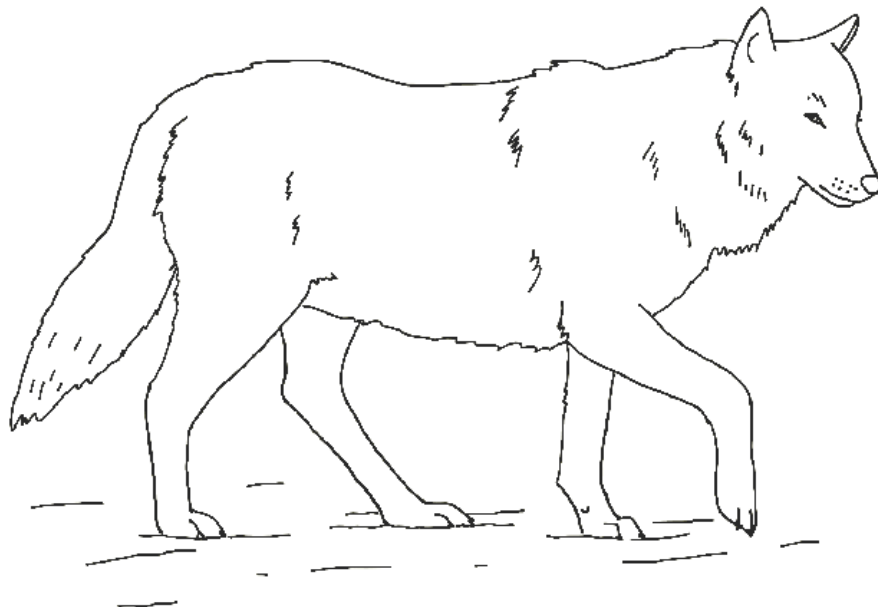
The hanger is large enough that two deer or elk can be processed at the same time.
